In my reading of the Gospel of Matthew to 'prepare room in my heart' for this festive season, I marvel once again at the mystery of Divine intervention in human history as the Eternal enters Time and the Infinite God became finite man, in the form of the infant Jesus.

The birth of Jesus was proclaimed to prophets and kings. Wise men went in search of Jesus and found him and worshipped him. Others like King Herod, were bent on destroying the divine and killing humans.

Jesus, the God Incarnate, had no qualms being born into a humble family, fleeing Bethlehem, the city of David to reside and grow up in Nazareth. "Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?" Christmas is also a time to celebrate our humanity, sharing dreams and hopes, and touching base with the rest of humanity, in solidarity with those who suffer injustice and are acquainted with sorrow and grief. At Christmas we remember that Jesus too suffered.

Christmas is a time to draw closer to God, sharing in the Divine Mystery, in the Divine Life and Love, and a time to serve and love our neighbours, whether across the street or around the world. What a way to celebrate Christmas!

Lausanne Singapore commemorates 40th year of Lausanne Movement

Theme: "The Whole Church in the Whole World"

Fifty friends of the Lausanne movement gathered at the GCF meeting hall in North Bridge Road on Sat 8 Nov 2014 for n afternoon tea fellowship to commemorate the 40th anniversary of the Lausanne movement. Lawrence Ko, SCGM's National Director and also the coordinator for Lausanne Singapore Committee, shared a brief history of the Lausanne Movement and the significance of the Lausanne Covenant for the evangelical church. He also shared of his participation in and benefit from the Lausanne gatherings from Asia Lausanne conferences in 2006 and 2011 to the Cape Town Conference in 2010, which saw a sizeable Singapore delegation of 20 participants. Lawrence also urged prayer and participation in Lausanne meetings such as the Global Lausanne Creation Care consultation which he attended. Later Sherry Hua and Hoi Wen also shared their experiences and involvement in the SE Asia Creation Care conference in 2014. Dr Rajendran, Associate Director of World Evangelical Alliance Mission Commission, then shared of global trends and how the whole church can be involved in the whole world in missions. Ailene Chou-Grandey, co-founder of Perspectives Singapore, challenged all to develop a perspective of a global Christian living out the call of God in everyday life. We praise God for the afternoon of networking and fellowship.

Creation Care in Urban Settings

A 8-week course on Creation Care in the Urban Settings was organised by TTC's Centre for Development of Christian Ministry with Lawrence Ko as the instructor. The course covered the needed Chrsitian response to the twin challenges of ecological crisis and rapid urbanisation especially in Asia. With the need to combat carbon gas emission and keep global temperature from rising to less than 2 degrees C, the local churches can play critical roles as agents of change in advancing decoupling and degrowth as radical acts needed in the cities to address resource scarcity as well as environmental degradation. The church is also invited to consider the roles of believers as Priests of Creation as an eschatological community, with the vision of creating future cities in anticipation of the new heavenly city which will descend upon earth.

FELLOWSHIP OF EVANGELICAL STUDENTS PARTICIPATED IN GREEN DESERT PROJECT



A team of 18 youths representing the Fellowship of Evangelical Students group participated in the Green Desert Project in Jun 2014, planting 1169 fir trees in Duolun County, Inner Mongolia. SCGM has been working with FES and especially NUS VCF in promoting creation care this year. The team, led by FES staff workers Sherry Hua and Siah May Lan, comprised of 16 ladies and 2 young men. Beginning from March 2014, the team gathered for a series of 8 training sessions facilitated by Lawrence Ko, building the team, acquiring servicelearning and cross-cultural skills and developing domain knowledge as environmental volunteers and activists. They completed a 2D/IN service retreat in Pulau Ubin in May 10-11, participating in the coastal clean-up with another Green Desert team from ITE College East. After spending 14 days in the grasslands of Inner Mongolia greening the desertified county five times the size of Singapore, they returned to prepare and organise the Youth Environmental Stewardship forum in August 16 2014 as a way to raise awareness about desertification and the ecological crisis.

The FES team helmed the Youth Environmental Stewardship (YES) Forum 2014 with Hsiao Fern as the Chairlady of the Organising Committee. Over 130 youths from schools, ITEs and JCs attended the morning event held at ITE College East on 16 Aug 2014, The FES team used performing arts to raise awareness of the beauty of nature, presenting a song "Bunga Sayang" extolling the evergreen tree in the tropics. They also presented a dance to the music of "I was here" by Beyonce. The choreographer and dancer, Andreia said: One part of my choreography showed the process of planting the tree, and I was the tree-planter, while my co-dancer lyn Yi was the tree. I started off by shovelling and digging the ground, followed by placing the fir sapling inside, and finally watering it, which saw it growing eventually. This piece symbolises the relationship between the tree and the human, and the closeness they experience with one another. This dance was one of my favourites, a most personal dance that was close to my heart, and I really love the meaningful lyrics. The participants also had break out group time to brainstorm best ideas for living green urban lifestyles and presented their proposals on stage afterwards. The novel idea was that the participants were asked to bring their own lunch boxes for the refreshments served, which they did. SCGM sponsored the portable cutlery sets, thanks to a grant from TRAC Board of Mission.
