It is only by grace through faith that I can, because He calls. In our brokenness, we receive His grace. In obedience, we begin to respond in action. By grace, we attempt, as Carey once said, the great things for God, and to expect great things from God. In the wilderness, we learn that we can begin anew. It is a rhythm of sunsets and sunrises.



We face many challenges in the world, where things have gone bad. G.K. Chesterton once saw an article entitled "What's wrong with the world?" He responded with a letter with just two words: "I am."

May God continue His work in the world through us by first cleansing us to be channels of His Grace. Only then can Divine Power and Divine Blessings flow...and overflow.

SCGM MISSIONS RESEARCH FORUM 2014





THEME: IN TOUCH IN THE CITY. 8 March 2014. Changi Cove

About 70 participants attended the inaugural SCGM Missions Research Forum 2014 at the lovely Changi Cove.

Lawrence Ko welcomed the participants with an introductory speech: "This missions research forum is part of SCGM new Strategic Thrust to encourage the growth of strategic thought leadership in missions from Singapore. It aims to provide a platform for the experienced missions practitioners as well as up and coming missionary entrepreneurs to think together on how we can tackle some of the challenges facing us in Asian missions in the 21st C. It is a research forum "for practitioners by practitioners", to provide thoughtful conversations on practical problems as well as innovative solutions.

Urbanisation in Asia is developing rapidly with more mega urban regions growing in Asia more than anywhere else in the world. The tallest buildings and largest cities are all found in Asia. These are the new missions fields of Asia in 21st C. While the rural and mountain villages still hold thousands of unreached people groups (UPGs), many of the unengaged UPGs are streaming into the cities in search of modernity and a better life, with great expectation and receptivity.

There is a certain dynamism in urban living which should excite us. Asian urbanisms present unprecedented challenges and immense opportunities for missions. How can the church in the cities truly engage as an incarnational church in urban settings? What do we need to do to become agents of transformational missions? We appreciate our presenters Darrell Dorr, Dr Ashok Kumar, Dr Peter Nitschke, Samuel Lim and Dr Quek Swee Hwa who are journeying with us as we explore new paradigms and encourage the implementation of effective missions models in Asian urban settings. May God raise up men and women to lead incarnational churches and innovative missional structures that can impact Asian cities in the 21st C." (NB:The papers presented will be published in 2014)

VOICE FOR THE VOICELESS

Asia Emerging Leaders Summit Jan 2014
Chiang Mai, Thailand

Asia Evangelical Alliance and Compassion Int'l jointly organised the Asian Emerging Leaders Forum to encourage and mentor younger Christian leaders to engage in the public square. Entitled "Voice for the Voiceless", the forum on thinking strategically was led by Dr Bambang Budijanto and featured Rev CB Samuel as the keynote speaker along with Rev Dr Vinay Samuel and Philip Koh. About 70 younger leaders, pastors and missions leaders attended the forum held in Chiang Mai on the week when the protest demonstrations started in Bangkok and on the college campuses in Chiang Mai. It was heart wrenching to see Thai leaders weep for the brokenness within their society, ripped apart by political strife and fragmentation.

The Forum raised a rhetorical question: "Do you have the Right to Remain Silent?" especially when injustice and corruption remains rampant in Asia and in many parts of the world. The Forum called for the Church and individual Christians to stand up and be a prophetic voice for Truth and justice. In partnership with the Micah Network and Compassion Int'l, the Forum pledged to raise a million signatures from the children and youth to call for an end to corruption so as to give the children hope for the future.

SAT7 Network Conference in Turkey, Mar 2014

The annual SAT7 Network conference 2014 was held in the lovely beachside town near Izmir, Turkey. Attended by 240 partners and participants, the conference was preceded by an international council meeting where guests like the Singaporean delegates Dean Kuan Kim Seng, Richard Ting and SGM ND Lawrence Ko were invited to sit in.

At the conference, the vision and goals of the media ministry which beams Christian programmes across the Middle East and North Africa were presented. The highlights included the new initiatives which include SAT7 Kids and SAT7 PARS, with the former reaching out to children and the latter in Farsi language reaching the believers in Iran, Tajikistan and Afghanistan. Creative feature programmes such as Forbidden, a talk show recently broadcast to North Africa especially the Tunisian believers, featured Dr Imed inviting artists, songwriters and poets to his show from different faiths.

The urgent call of SAT7 ministry was to reach the children, especially the millions in and from Syria, torn apart by civil war, traumatised by war, violence and hopelessness, and who may grow up without opportunities for education. Providing educational media programmes would be a great way to broadcast hope in the midst of hopelessness not only for children, but for their parents as well as they ponder what would become of this "Lost Generation". Would there be a response from Singapore to assist in an urgent mission to bring hope to the hopeless?


