NEXT GENERATION MISSIONS STUDY

An initiative conducted by Singapore Centre for Global Missions, in partnership with:

Bartley Christian Church, Church of our Saviour, Covenant Evangelical Free Church, Glad Tidings Church, Interserve Singapore, OM Singapore, OMF Singapore, Radion International and Woodlands Evangelical Free Church.



PROJECT PURPOSE

To uncover insights to help **local churches** adapt and grow in their work of

Educating, Mobilizing* and **Preparing**the **next generation** (under 40 year olds)
for **long-term cross-cultural missions** ("missions").

* Includes helping them discern and clarify the call to go



Two Groups, Two Surveys, Similar Content

Next Gen Missions
Workers

153 respondents

From 79 churches

Missions Leaders

129 Respondents

100 from local church, 29 from missions agency/NGO

Represent 81 churches and

13 agencies/NGOs



Next Gen Missions Workers

153 respondents, from 79 churches

Min. 6 month commitment for cross-cultural missions outside of Singapore (may or may not be already deployed)

Deployed before age 40

Involved in various capacities (career missionary, missional professional, NGO worker, itinerant evangelist and etc)

59% sent through missions agency/Christian NGO (usually in partnership with local church)

25% directly sent by local church



Missions Leaders

129 Respondents

100 from local church, 29 from missions agency/NGO

Represent 81 churches and 13 agencies/NGOs

Mix of Senior Pastor, Missions Chair, Agency leader, Mobilization staff, and etc. (similar profile of responses)



AGE AND GENDER DISTRIBUTION


MALE FEMALE








DISCERNING THE CALL

How old were they? How long did it take before they went? Who were significant influences and what were significant events that helped clarify their call?




AGE OF FIRST CALLING AND OF GETTING DEPLOYED





If discerned a call between 16 – 20 years old, most take 9 years ± 5 before getting deployed; If discerned a call between 21 – 25 years old, most take 5 years ± 4.7 before getting deployed.

PRAYER as a "Significant Event"

I prayed about this "calling" (to West Asia) as I wasn't sure if it was simply a moment of impulse, I wanted clarity from God.

I joined a 40-day prayer event for the unreached at the age of 19.

CL, 32 years old

I was attending a very mission minded church and they had missionaries speak at the prayer meeting regularly when I was a teenager.

JWSJ, 53 years old

Experienced God's love pouring into my heart through a moment of prayer in the cinema after watching the Passion of the Christ in 2004

N, 35 years old



At the age of 22, I thought about my life so that God could use me. I prayed for almost a year. LYF, 31 years old

I was at an overnight church prayer meeting in 2002.
Had fasted and prayed, and somehow felt a burden for the nations.

AY, 39 years old

I was praying and seeking specifically for cross-cultural work when I was 37. GN, 45 years old





- Provide Support (Prayer, Financial) [32]
- Working with Missions Agencies [13]

What are key issues that 'prevent' people from going?

What were key concerns when preparing someone to go?

The role of Local Churches in preparation



Missions Leaders: What Factors prevent the Next Gen from going?

Based on personal experience of engaging next gen...

- Financial Considerations [40]
- Family Commitments [34]
- Lack of Clear Calling [32]
- Lack of Support from Family / Spouse [22]
- Unwilling to give up life in Singapore / Cost of Going [17]

How can the church help to 'lower' these barriers?



Missions Leaders: What are Next Gen Concerns when preparing to go?

Top 5 Concerns (based on engagement experience)

- Clarity of Calling [95]
- Personal Finances [82]
- Getting adequate Cross-Cultural training / experience [72]
- Support of Parents [70]
- Support of Spouse / future Spouse [62]

These concerns are shared by the sending church, with additional concern that the missions worker is 'emotionally ready' and maintains a good relationship with the church.



Next Gen Missions Workers:

What were our Concerns when Preparing?

Top 5 Concerns

- Personal Finances [77] **
- Getting adequate Cross-Cultural training / experience [77] **
- Clarity of Calling [75]
- Support of Parents [73] **
- Getting adequate vocational skills / experience [52]


** these factors were in retrospect important for ministry effectiveness in the field.

Add to that: Getting specific mission field knowledge;

Getting supportive home church community



LOCAL CHURCH SUPPORT FOR MISSIONS WORKER PREPARATION





Church Missions Leaders:How can Churches Help Prepare someone?

- Training and Equipping [64]
- Journey with them (prayer & emotional support) [62]
- Mentoring and Discipling [49]
- Provide Ministry exposure in church [43]
- Provide Financial Support [41]



Next Gen Workers: In Retrospect, how could my local Church have done more in preparing me?

Consistent and Committed Support e.g. Pastoral/emotional/mentorship/discipleship/guidance. [29]

Deeper connection with home church e.g. prayer, platforms to speak, cell group. [20]

Training (what to expect/ what to do) e.g. educational - theological, cultural; administrative. [20]

For every 4 people who said their church was doing everything well, 1 said that their church was not doing anything.



Summary Observations

- Many ways for the local church to mobilize the Next Generation...
- Requires a **whole-of-church** ministry approach
 - Missions teaching starting from youth ministry (or earlier)
 - Long-term journeying alongside individuals
 - Missions Policy that addresses concerns
- Part of a community of missions-minded churches / agencies / organic groups
